A new kitten

What to expect during your first year!

Kittens need a series of vaccinations, just like human babies do. Until they've completed this series, they should not be exposed to any pets outside of their own home.

Kittens can be spayed / neutered and de-clawed at 4 months of age OR 2 weeks after rabies vaccine is given. This is also a great time to microchip you kitten.

Kitten Vaccination and De-worming schedule

8-11 weeks of age:

An Examination by the veterinarian, FVRCP vaccine, intestinal parasite test (fecal), and deworming. Try to bring a fresh stool sample to this visit.

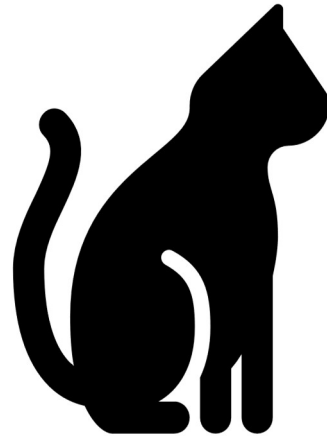
11-13 weeks of age:

FVRCP vaccine, FIV/Leukemia Test, Leukemia vaccine (if test is negative), and deworming (administered by veterinary technician)

14-16 weeks of age:

FVRCP vaccine, Leukemia vaccine, intestinal parasite test (fecal), de-worming, and Rabies vaccine (administered by veterinarian). Try to bring a fresh stool sample to this visit.

***One year after the final FVRCP, Leukemia and Rabies vaccination is given, a booster is required. Thereafter, these vaccines can be given every 3 years.



Revolution applied once a month will protect your cat from heartworms, fleas, ear mites, and intestinal parasites that are potentially deadly to your cat.

Some of these parasites are transmittable to humans.
