## Core vaccines recommended based on University of Florida vaccine protocol

#### **FVRCP**

River Ridge Animal Clinic uses the recommended vaccine protocol that has been issued by the University of Florida. Their recommendations for "core" vaccines (basic minimum vaccines for all kittens) include FVRCP. This vaccine protects against:

- o <u>Feline Viral Rhinotracheitis</u> (aka feline herpes,) a highly contagious respiratory disease characterized by sneezing, loss of appetite, fever, and eye inflammation.
- <u>Calicivirus</u>, another serious feline respiratory infection with which cats may show signs of ulcers on the tongue.
- <u>Panleukopenia</u> (aka feline distemper): a contagious disease who symptoms include fever, loss of appetite, vomiting, and diarrhea.

This vaccine must be boostered 3 weeks after the initial injection in cats that have never received this vaccine before. The cost for this vaccine is \$20 .00.

Rabies vaccination is required by Florida state law and is not an optional vaccine. This vaccination is				
administered between 14 and 16 weeks of age. The cost for this vaccine is \$18 .00.

Optional vaccines recommended based on risk factors				
Feline Leukemia Vaccine				
Feline leukemia virus is the leading viral killer of cats. The virus is spread through the saliva and nasal secretions				
of infected cats. Infection is transmitted through prolonged contact with infected cats, bite wounds, and from an infected mother cat to her kittens. Cornell University estimates that fewer than 20% of infected cats will survive more than 3 years after being infected. The veterinarians at River Ridge animal clinic recommend that BE tested prior to vaccination. This vaccine must be boostered 3 weeks after the initial injection. The cost for this vaccine is

## Feline Leukemia/FIV (feline immunodeficiency virus) Test

All new kittens and cats being brought into a household should be tested for feline leukemia and FIV. The veterinarians at River Ridge animal clinic recommend testing annually for cats at risk for these diseases. The cost of this test is \$38.00.

## **Fecal Parasite Analysis**

According to the US government's center for disease control, some dog and cat parasites can be transmitted to
humans, especially small children and immunosuppressed family members. These parasites can potentially cause
serious health problems such as skin rashes, intestinal disease, blindness, seizures, encephalitis, and meningitis.
We recommend a fecal parasite test (microscopic examination of the feces) be performed annually for adult
dogs. Many of these parasites cannot be seen by the naked eye. The cost for this test is \$26.00.

#### **Wellness Bloodwork**

Similar to the bloodwork your physician performs on you, bloodwork done on your cat may indicate an underlying medical condition or the results can be used as a baseline for comparison in the future. Many diseases are treatable when discovered in the early stages. A wellness profile includes a biochemical analysis which measures the following:

ALT,ALP	These are liver enzymes. They help indicate a problem with the liver.
	They may also be abnormal with inflammation of the pancreas.
Total Bilirubin	Test for jaundice. Increased levels may indicate liver disorder or
	damaged red blood cells.
Total Protein, Albumin	Protein levels associated with disorders of the intestine, kidney, and
	liver.
Creatinine, BUN	Indicators of kidney function, which should be run in conjunction with
	a urinalysis to accurately assess kidney function
Glucose	Blood sugar. Increased levels may indicate diabetes.

Also included in the wellness profile bloodwork is a total T4 (thyroid test). The cost for this bloodwork is \$75.00.
